

Venezuela's Election Crisis

The Venezuela crisis is a desperate attempt by the Bolivian revolutionaries to regain control of long-term decision-making. To contain the threat of greater scarcity and rising unemployment cause by years of economic sanctions from the North American Union.

To declare victory in the face of political contradiction, undermines democratic norms. Yet desperate action to maintain socialist ideology -- to sustain civil interests that aim to assert both their cultural heritage and nationalist-aspiration for self-determination, can mean that illegitimate political interests will conspire to undermine an inherently democratic country to regain control of short-term gains (though social democracy has met its permanent demise, international markets are attuned to desperate decision-making on the part of *rogue nations*).

The only avenue is not to condemn desperation, but to address desperate political acts before they solidify into mass-slaughter, conflict and/or war-crime.
